SAFE NEIGHBORHOODS – Our City must have safe neighborhoods. First responders deserve fair compensation and benefits. JSO has a staffing deficiency when compared to our peer cities. The Taxation, Revenue, and Utilization of Expenditures Commission passed my plan to fully fund the police on August 4, 2022. It adds 148 officers annually over 8 years and provides better trained law enforcement officers. It is funded by growth in our tax base without increasing taxes.

SMART GROWTH - Our City must accommodate growth. Land use policies can foster growth with development density and use existing infrastructure for effective, efficient, and resilient growth. Transit Oriented Development aligned with existing railroad rights of way create higher density with pedestrian scale development and commuter rail. This approach adds more housing units with improved affordability, better resiliency, and protects environmentally sensitive areas. The JEA must diversify its power generation portfolio to meet increased demand.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY – Our City must control tax burdens and spending.

Economic development incentives should have transparency, reflect public priorities, and optimize investment returns. We currently generate adequate financial resources to fund essential urban services. Our millage rate should remain stable to provide a solid financial foundation for our city.
